

Infrastructure

Self-Circulation Kiosk: Central Library implemented Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) enabled kiosk. This latest technology is being used to automate book handling process including book circulation and inventory management.



- Anti-theft Gate Antenna: RFID technology helps to alert the library security staff in case of any unintentional activity of not following the proper procedure of book issue/return.
- Lending Counter: To expand the physical space of the central library a mezzanine floor has been built in the Lending Section of the library in 2017 which fetches a picturesque view of the Lending Section.



Uniform Rack System: Library Service is under the purview of Service Sector. So to make the service qualitative physical appearance plays a vital role. Considering this, a uniform rack system has been installed in the library. Previously books were kept in shelves not uniform in design, now

• **Server Machine:** Two server machines (installed at the Server Room on the 1st floor) are available 24x7, one for running library automation software KOHA and maintaining institutional repository DSpace; another

for execution of e-attendance software along with e-book access management software.

- Book Binding Section: At the ground floor one room with book binding tools are there to work for bindery.
- Reprography: One photocopy machine (installed at the Server Room on the 1st floor) is available for providing reprography and printing facilities.



- **CCTV Camera:** For better surveillance 42 CCTV cameras have been installed inside and outside the library. These are operational 24x7.
- Water Filter: One high-flow water purifier is kept for safe drinking water facility.
- **Fire Extinguisher:** For library safety and security nineteen fire extinguisher cylinders are kept in different sections inside the library.
- Cubicle for E-Resource Access: Six internet enabled terminals are available for accessing e-resources both subscribed and open sources, semester question papers and also for searching OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue).
- Cubicle for Faculty Advanced
 Studies and Research: One
 cubicle equipped with internet facility is available for faculty members for
 their advanced studies and research.



E-Resource Access Section for Advanced Studies & Research: Fr. Verstraeten Central Library E-Resource Centre for Advanced Studies and Research is a newly developed state-of-the-art E-Resource Library equipped with twenty five tabs.



- Wi-Fi facility: Library premises are Wi-Fi enabled and fully air conditioned.
- Computerised Attendance System: Browser based attendance software for counting footfalls at the reception counter.



Issue, Re-Issue, Return Statistics (July'19-March'20)




Facilities and Services

1. Library Catalogue Access through Web OPAC

Library operations are fully automated using open source software Koha (Ver:16.05) and an online catalogue for the entire holdings of books, CD/DVDs, Reports etc is accessible (24x7) within the library premises as well as outside the campus from the library website at www.sxccal.edu

How to use Web OPAC:

Go to College website (www.sxccal.edu) and click 'Library' then click 'Web OPAC' where user can find the single window search interface.

The class number denotes the subject area to which the concerned book belongs. The book number has two parts, the first part denotes first three alphabets of the author's surname, and the second part title indicator contain first three alphabets of the title of the book excluding article, i.e. (A), (An) and (The).

2. My Library

Go to college website (www.sxccal.edu) and click 'Library' then Central Library and click 'My Library' where you can find the login portal.

Login to your account with Your College CIN No. Login ID: (eg. 16-500-5-07-0000) and the password. (The default password is: 12345 but we request you to change the password as soon as possible to avoid misuse).

From the 'my summary' tab, user will see all of the items they have checked out with the overdue items highlighted in red. User will be able to renew their issued books from the OPAC **before due date**. If any fine is there it will be shown in the 'Fines' column.

Patrons can view their personal details by clicking on the 'my personal details' tab. Patrons can edit their details in this form and click 'Submit Changes'.

The Reading History tab reveals entire check out history of the patron. User can sort by date or title to view Checkout history.

Patrons can make purchase suggestions for the library books from your purchase suggestions tab.

3. Online Books Reservation

Users can reserve books which are already on loan and when it becomes available users will be informed through e-mail for collection of the reserved book.

4. Book Bank Facility

The students belonging to non-creamy layer of the society can issue at most four books from book-bank for a full semester along with regular library facilities.



5. Free Book Distribution Service

Old edition books are distributed among the interested students on first come first serve basis.

6. Services for Ex-Student, Alumni/nae

The ex-students of the college can enjoy reading room facility subject to approval from the authority.

7. Semester Question Paper

For accessing previous semester question paper visit college website (www.sxccal.edu) and click on **'Library'**, then click **'Web OPAC'** where user can find the following search interface.

This facility is available only from library E-Resource Access Section within 9AM to 4PM (Mon-Fri)



8. E-Book Access from E-Resource Centre for Advanced Studies and Research

Fr. Verstraeten Central Library E-Resource Centre for Advanced Studies and Research is a newly developed state-of-the-art E-Resource Library. Student can access the facility via college intranet with the help of tabs, smart phones,



and other devices. The students/ staff should collect their Wi-Fi login name and password from the computer centre and after login to the Wi-Fi network of the college under SXC-STUDENT Wi-Fi. Then they have to open any search engine i.e. Google or Google Chrome or Safari or Explorer and type this link http://10.10.26.125:200 to have a look on the e-books which are arranged subject wise.

9. Reprography Service

Reprographic facility is available for the students and faculty members at a very nominal rate of Re.1/- per one A4 size impression (for photocopy) and Rs.2/- only per one A4 size page (for print out). This section remains open from 9.00 A.M. to 4.00 P.M. (Monday to Friday).



- The photocopy can be taken only from library reference books, journals and question papers.
- Time for placing photocopy requisition: 9.30 A.M. to 12.30 P.M. at the library office.
- Maximum twenty pages can be photocopied at a time.
- Articles in the newspapers can also be photocopied. Cost per single side impression is Rs. 3/- only.

10. Career Guidance

Books related to General Knowledge, NET/SET, different competitive examinations like Bank P.O., Railways, GMAT, CAT, SAT, CLAT, etc. are also available for reference purpose.



11. New Arrivals Display

Newly arrived books are displayed for 2 weeks in the Reference Section.

12. Newspapers' Corner

SXC CL subscribes 10 newspapers (English=7, Bengali=2, Hindi=1). User can also access softcopy from the link https://www.sxccal.edu/e-resources/



13. Periodical Section

145+ periodicals are subscribed for library reference section. User can also access softcopy from the link https://www.sxccal.edu/e-resources/. In-house publications are also available in this section.



14. Audio Visual Section

Audio visual materials such as CD, DVDs are also available in the Reference as well as Lending Section.



RFID enabled self-circulation kiosk would allow the users to utilise self-issue and reissue service without standing in queue. When books are borrowed, an auto generated

'checkout' slip comes out from the machine, giving details of the borrower and the issued/ re-issued books and the 'due date of return' etc. Using the kiosk one could also check their account status—books details in their accounts and pending overdue charges, if any.



16. Lending Facility

Students can borrow utmost four



books, CD/DVDs at a time for fourteen days, with their valid own ID card which are further renewable for fourteen days (except in special cases). Online renewal can also be done from library website with this link http://115.243.61.182:8001/



17. Reference Facility

Open Access system is followed in the Reference Section. There are two stateof-the-art reading rooms with a seating capacity of 250 users. The reference





books are used only inside the reading rooms by the students for their study and research.

18. Rare Documents

The library of the college holds a golden treasury of very old and rare documents due to donations of books to the library by the provincial governments and European missionaries during the last two centuries. The documentary heritage is continuously decaying with time towards extinction, which is our national cultural loss. There is an urgent need of proper conservation

and preservation of documentary heritage of the college. A project on preservation and conservation of rare documents was undertaken by the college to prevent this loss with the full financial support from UNESCO; which was started on 12th December, 2006. The oldest collection dates back to AD 1632. To conclude the project, a set of 4 DVDs containing some of the digitized documents and rare painting was published.





21. Property Counter

The property counter is located at the entrance of the library. All the users are requested to keep their bags without any valuable property (Mobile Phone, Money Purse etc.) at the property counters before entering into the library.

22. Group Study

Two group study cubicles on the first floor are available for group discussion and presentation. One cubicle located in between two reference sections for students and another one for faculty and research scholars beside the reprography section. The cubicles are well equipped with computers and internet facility.





23. Research Tools

As per the recommendation from NAAC Peer Team for anti-plagiarism software to check on plagiarism and also to comply with the UGC (Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2018 i-Thenticate from Turnitin (USA) has been introduced. Research scholars and faculty members can access this facility only for their research purpose and academic publication.

24. E-Attendance

Students must scan their college ID card to the eattendance system at the reception counter during entry and exit time. On the basis of the time spent in reading at the library users are awarded.

INFLIBNET-NLIST:

Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre is an autonomous

Inter-University Centre of the University Grants Commission (UGC) of India. It was initiated by



the UGC in March 1991 as a project under the IUCAA and became an independent Inter-University Centre in June 1996. It provides links to JStor, Shodhganga and many other e-resources.



JSTOR: Access to JStor is provided through INFLIBNET and hence can be logged-in only through INFLIBNET.

DOAJ: Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) is a community-curated online directory that indexes and provides access to innumerable high quality, open access, peer-reviewed journals.

IndiaStat: IndiaStat: IndiaStat serves as an authentic and perhaps the most comprehensive compilation of secondary level socioeconomic statistical information about India and its states on various socioeconomic parameters.

DELNET: Millions of networked library resources are Developing Library Network accessible from this network.

Indian Academy of Sciences: The Indian Academy of Sciences, founded in 1934 by Professor C.V. Raman, Nobel Laureate, endeavours to promote the progress and uphold the cause of science, both in pure and applied branches. It publishes many science journals that can be accessed here.



CMIE-Prowess IQ: Prowess is the largest database of the financial performance of Indian companies. Annual Reports of individual companies are available from this database.



Economic Outlook: It provides economic forecasts and insights with real time analysis of data releases and copious indicator data.



Down to Earth: An environmental journal from Centre for Science and Environment that brings news, perspectives and knowledge to prepare for change in the way we manage our environment.



National Digital Library of India: Ministry of Human Resource Development under its National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology has initiated the National Digital Library (NDL) pilot project to

develop a framework of virtual repository of learning resources with a singlewindow search facility. It is being developed to help students to prepare for entrance and competitive examination, to enable people to learn and prepare from best practices from all over the world and to facilitate researchers to perform inter-linked exploration from multiple sources.

Commerce student tops honours list with seven hours of reading a day

Xavier's to reward library regulars

Park Street: Three undergraduate students of St Xavier's College will receive awards for putting in more library hours a day than anyone else in an unannounced contest that aims to incentivise the dying habit of reading and researching the oldfashioned way.

"The awards have been instituted to encourage our students to spend more time in the library," Father Dominic Savio, the principal of St Xavier's College (Autonomous), Calcutta, said on Tuesday.

Chandra Roy, a BCom student in the morning section, has been adjudged first for spending around seven hours a day in the college library. Chandra would attend lectures for five hours every working day and spend another seven hours on an average reading in the library.

Arghyamalya Biswas, and Manali Mondal of the political science department finished second and third respectively with around six hours in thelibrary every day. This is in addition to attending lectures for five hours, as is the norm at St Xavler's.

Teachers across institutions lament that students no longer want to spend time studying in libraries. The trend isn't different at St Xavier's, although academic standards remain high.

"Nowadays, very few people spend much time in the library. So, when we found these three students putting in hours in the library, we decided to reward them. Our intention is to encourage other students to do the same and regenerate interest in reading," the principal said.

The revamped library at St Xavier's remains open from 7am till 7pm on weekdays. At a certain time of day, the library



is packed. But most students read there only for a while. "We want to generate the inclination among students to use the library facility as much as possible, just as these three students did." Father Savio

said.

The project to revamp the library and make it more attractive to students was an extension of the initiative to rekindle interest in reading.

A veteran librarian wel-

comed the decision by St Xavier's to introduce an incentive to read in the library as "a good move". But he said this needs to be complemented by other steps such as designing courses in a way that students are compelled to do library work.

"Students will not go to the libraries if they can manage without doing additional reading. Therefore, the currisulum should be such that they have to do library work. Faculty members must demand that this be done." said the expert, who has worked in libraries acroes reputable institutions such as Harvard, the State University of New York in Butfalo and the University of California. Santa Cruz.
