# How Do Libraries Play a Pivotal Role in Advancing Social Science Research by Providing Access to Comprehensive Resources and Supporting Researchers in Navigating Vast Amount of Information?



In the contemporary world, information plays a vital role and has become a basic requirement in the pursuit of the development of humanity and the nation as a whole. Hence, accessibility to information for academic purposes and other needs like leisure or entertainment has become a prime need in this transforming society. For ages, an intricate relationship has existed between books and libraries that serve as a conduit

between individuals and their personal development to contribute to society. For Social Sciences, that can broadly be defined as a branch of science that deals with the institutions and functioning of human society and with the interpersonal relationships of individuals as members of society; a disciplined and systematic study of society and its institutions, and of how and why people behave as they do, both as individuals and in groups within society, libraries, especially public libraries, besides institution libraries, have been the most enriching means to access valuable resources, especially for researchers and budding scholars to develop their knowledge in their respective fields of interest. They render services to access printed versions of academic books published by renowned publishers, procuring several official documents in printed versions that are a part of the national heritage.

However, as the world has undergone a significant transition from analogue to digital in every field, libraries have also become advanced in assisting researchers and scholars to get hold of their needed resources in digital formats. They have already started establishing their Electronic-Resources Center or 'E-Resource

Center' for the students to access books, online journal articles, official documents, and digital archives that are published by learned societies and communities/publishers in digitized versions. PROWESS IQ Database/CMIE is a notable facility as libraries are subscribing to e-library resources. This is of immense help to the students and scholars, faculties of Management, and discipline of Economics. It serves as an interactive query able database for corporate and financial data of the listed and unlisted companies in India. It has to be kept in mind that for any researcher, undertaking a rigorous literature review for the proposed research area is significant. Literature Review indicates a continuous procedure to discover academic deficits and identify the premises that were not delved into earlier, thus facilitating new contributions to the research arena and identifying gaps. Thus, in-depth reading concerning the topic of interest becomes important for them. This further necessitates exploring the role of librarians in this regard. As the digitized era has already begun, besides providing facilities to students to procure resources in digital formats, libraries have also installed WIFI networking and multiple electric extension boards to enable students, scholars, and researchers to access their laptops with free internet access for academic activities. Moreover, libraries have also been subscribing to regional language journals to promote social sciences in regional dialects. This rightly indicates the importance of libraries that have installed an over-arching network of resources for the users to foster enrichment in Social Sciences.

It performs vital activities of the Research Information Management System by collecting and managing research-oriented information, databases, publications, research projects, fellowships, collaborations, patents, thrust-areas, innovations etc. aligned with

the institution's research policies. This provides a platform for accessing resource-centric information pertaining to knowledge capital comprising Digital Library & Information, Intellectual Property Facilitation, and Software for Quantitative Methods & Data Analysis, Analytical and Consultancy Services.

Libraries should ensure availability of digital means through automation by using a suitable Integrated Learning Management System facilitating the use of e-journals, books and by providing remote access to such e-resources. These features are also important indicators of the quality of an academic institution.

### Some Examples of Key Facilities and Services of St. Xavier's College Central Library in this regard:

1. Library Collection of e-books, digital databases, journals, e-journals, CD/DVDs, Reports, PhD theses
  - (a) E-books from NLIST platform, ProQuest, DELNET, etc.
  - (b) Rare books for historical research: These are digitised with UNESCO funding.
  - (c) Digital Databases such as CMIE-hosted Prowess IQ and Economic Outlook, ProQuest One Literature, IndiaStat hosted by Datanet.
  - (d) Anti-Plagiarism Software – iThenticate and DrillBit
2. Library Catalogue Access through Web OPAC
3. Institutional Repository using D-Space open-source software
4. Remote access to online databases, e-journals, eBooks

In summary, the library plays a vital role in promoting quality academic research in a Higher Education Institution.
